HOW ARE YOUR BENEFITS PAID?

Your benefits are based on the amount of money you have paid into the Social Security fund since you turned 18 and the amount of quarters you have worked. You must have worked 5 of the last 10 years prior to becoming disabled to be eligible for Disability Insurance Benefits. If you have not worked long enough you may still be eligible for Supplemental Security Income

WHAT JIM DOES FOR YOU:

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SOCIAL SECURITY EVALUATES YOUR DISABILITY IN A FIVE STEP PROCESS. THEY ARE:

ARE YOU CURRENTLY WORKING?

If you are working I determine if your earnings are above the amount that you cannot receive benefits.

IS YOUR MEDICAL CONDITION SEVERE?

I help prove that you have a severe impairment which will keep you from working 12 or more consecutive months.

IS YOUR MEDICAL CONDITION ON THE SOCIAL SECURITY LISTING OF IMPAIRMENTS?

I try to prove that your condition meets the social Security listing of impairments which will make you a winner automatically.

CAN YOU PERFORM ANY OF YOUR PRIOR JOBS?

If you do not meet the listed impairments I then prove that you are unable to do any of your past work.

CAN YOU DO ANY OTHER TYPE OF WORK BASED ON YOUR AGE, MEDICAL RESTRICTIONS, EDUCATION, AND PAST WORK?

I then use all of my resources to prove that you are unable to engage in any substantial gainful employment.



Disability is defined as being unable to work as a result of your age, education, past work history and your physical and mental impairments. 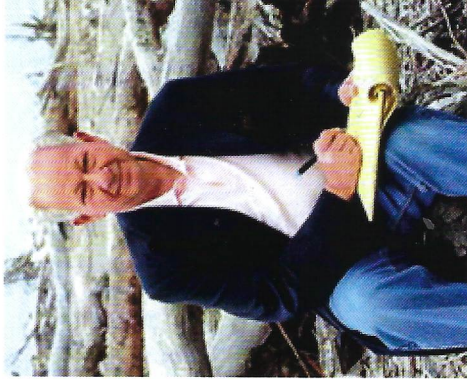

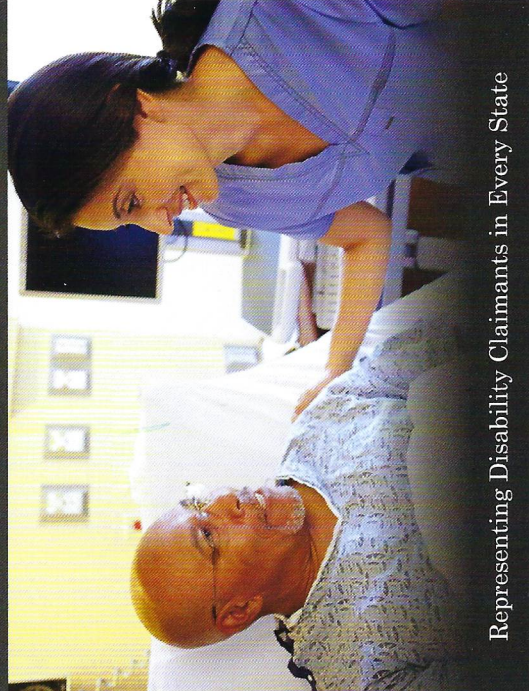

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HISTORY OF SOCIAL SECURITY

Social Security came into existence on August 14, 1935. It was originally designed to be a social insurance program to help the retired as well as to help dependent children.

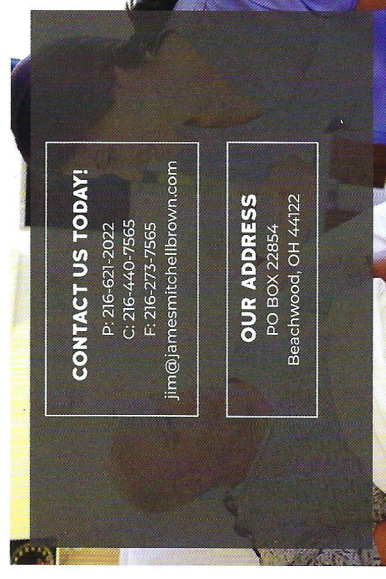
Social Security has expanded throughout the years. In 1956 Disability benefits were created for people between the ages of 50 and 65. In 1960 the age 50 requirement was eliminated. In 1968 benefits for disabled widows and widowers over age 50 was enacted.

In 1972 people on disability became entitled to Medicare after 24 months of entitlement.

In 1979 a system of Sequential Evaluation was established in an attempt to create national uniformity on decisions. This change made it far more difficult for people under age 50 to receive benefits.

When Ronald Reagan became president, he attempted to terminate 500,000 people per year from disability. His administration also made it far more difficult for claimants to prove their entitlement to disability. The amount of people requesting representation increased from under 10% to over 80% because of changes that have been made since then.

This summary omits some of the changes that have been made through the years. It is intended to be an overview of the history of Social Security.



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
